WCB CLEARANCE CERTIFICATES



Are you hiring contractors or subcontractors this fall? A Clearance Certificate/Letter of Good Standing confirms that the contractor has Workers' Compensation coverage and that their Workers' Compensation account is in good standing. It is easy to request one for any contractor or subcontractor you hire on the Workers' Compensation website. You don't want to be responsible for the cost of covering them while they work for you or have your own assessment rates go up because of an injury. The length of time the clearance is valid for varies based on the province so be sure to check with your provincial Workers' Compensation board.


